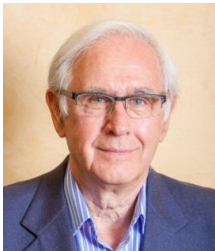


Professionals Planning to Work Abroad (or Coming Home): Do your Homework!
